Associate Advisory Committee Meeting February 28, 2019 AASP-MN Office

Meeting Recap

I. WELCOME AND CALL TO ORDER

The Associate Advisory Committee meeting was called to order by Dave Bock. Cell phone policy was noted and those present introduced themselves.

II. BRIEFING: ISSUES/INITIATIVES

Collision Division

AASP-MN's legislative initiative this year is a proposal to help shops get paid for OEM repair procedures like scanning, etc. The bill would make it an unfair claims practice for an insurer to deny payment for repair operations and procedures performed in accordance with the original vehicle manufacturer's documented technical procedures. (It would not change current law regarding the types of parts to be used in the repair of a damaged vehicle.) The association is partnering with the Alliance of Automobile Manufacturers and also has support from the Automotive Service Association and Society of Collision Repair Specialists.

The air quality rulemaking process is complete and AASP-MN has communicated the details to its members. The new regulations establish emission limits that will allow many shops to be considered "conditionally-exempt sources". As such, these shops will be subject to certain recordkeeping requirements in lieu of permits.

AASP-MN also recently had an introductory meeting with the new Commissioner of Commerce – Steve Kelley. This is an ongoing practice to ensure that repair industry concerns are clearly understood by key personnel at the Department of Commerce.

Mechanical Division

Enrollment for the 2019 *Get to Know Your Neighborhood Auto Repair Pro*[™] campaign is currently under way. The program continues to be valued by those who participate.

MNCARS (Minnesota Careers in Auto Repair & Service) Update

MNCARS continues to participate in events to promote careers and education in the collision repair and auto service industry. The entire industry is encouraged to utilize the resources found in the MotorMouth toolbox.

III. MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

Judell reported that, although AASP-MN achieved a 90% retention rate for 2018 renewals, it ended the year with a net loss of 13 members.

IV. OTHER OLD/NEW BUSINESS
